Inquest. indented taken at the dwelling house of Hugh McDowell
in the County aforesaid the 20th day of March in the year 1800. before
us John Hindcock and James Taggart two of the Justices of the peace
for said County upon view of the body of Jacob a Slave the property
of Joseph Spratt, then and there lying dead and upon the oath of
Daniel Smith, John Porter, Wm. Todd, John Berryhill, Samuel Berry
John Steppworth, John Taylor, Abraham Taylor, William Campbell
Joseph Wilson, John Cathcart and John Barron the good and lawful
men of the County aforesaid who being charged and sworn to
enquire how and in what manner the said Slave by his death came
upon this Oath do say that on the 19th of this instant the said
Slave was found near the house of the said McDowell with a
large wound in his forehead which they suppose either to be
done with an ax or an Iron wedge and that he came to
his death in a violent way but cannot tell by whence
from all the evidence they could get. In testimony whereof
as well we the said Justices and Jurors aforesaid to this
Inquisition have generally given our hands and seals the day
and place first above mentioned Daniel Smith
